


Bus information (numbers, pickup/drop off times) will be coming out soon. Families should hear directly from the Office of Transportation.


School Meals Information for 24-25 School Year

Homewood Center will be participating in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Program called Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) in the 24-25 school year. This means that all students attending Homewood Center are eligible to receive breakfast and lunch at no charge throughout the 24-25 school year, regardless of family or household income. The school breakfasts and lunches that we serve follow U.S. Department of Agriculture guidelines for healthy school meals.

Health Forms and Vaccination Clinics

Any medications required during school hours including prescription, "over-the-counter" (OTC) and homeopathic/herbal medications require a medication order signed by an approved health care provider and are subject to the HCPSS medication policy and procedure. A new medication order is required for every new school year dated on or after July 1. All students must have the required State of Maryland immunizations in order to attend school. Boys and Girls Clubs of Metropolitan Baltimore will be opening a Club here in Howard County. The Club will be located at Howard Community College. The age range for this club is 11-18 years old (middle and high school students). There are no eligibility requirements.

The program is free- so it is first come, first serve! This Club's capacity for this school year is

Changes in Cell Phone Policy for Gateway Middle School

As we prepare for the upcoming year, we want to inform you about an important change in our cell phone policy for the Gateway Middle School Program. To ensure a focused and productive learning environment, we will be implementing a NO CELL PHONE policy during class time. The research is clear, cell phone use for middle school aged students during the school day is detrimental to their learning. Cell phone use and social media access contribute to 70% of the stress our middle school students are experiencing.

To support our students' availability to learn during the school day, students will be required to place their phones in YONDR pouches at the beginning of each class. These pouches will allow students to keep their phones with them, but they will not be accessible during instructional time. We believe this policy will help minimize distractions and enhance the educational experience for all students. We will review this policy with our students at orientation and on the first day of school. We appreciate your support and cooperation in making this a successful transition.

Changes in Social Media and Gaming Access

Beginning July 1, <u>HCPSS will block access</u> to social media at all schools and most game

websites at middle and high schools only on the HCPSS instructional (student)
